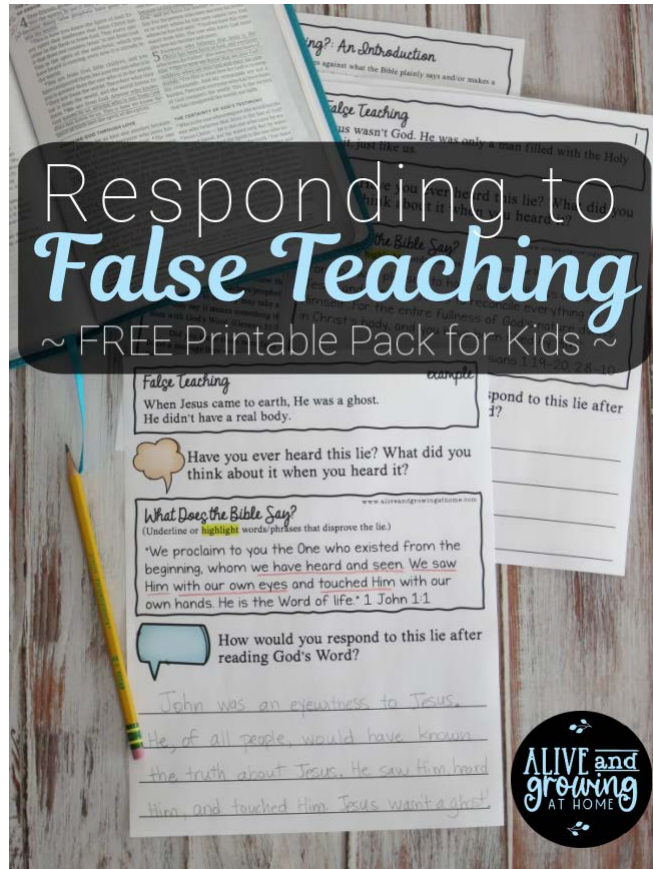


Responding to False Teaching

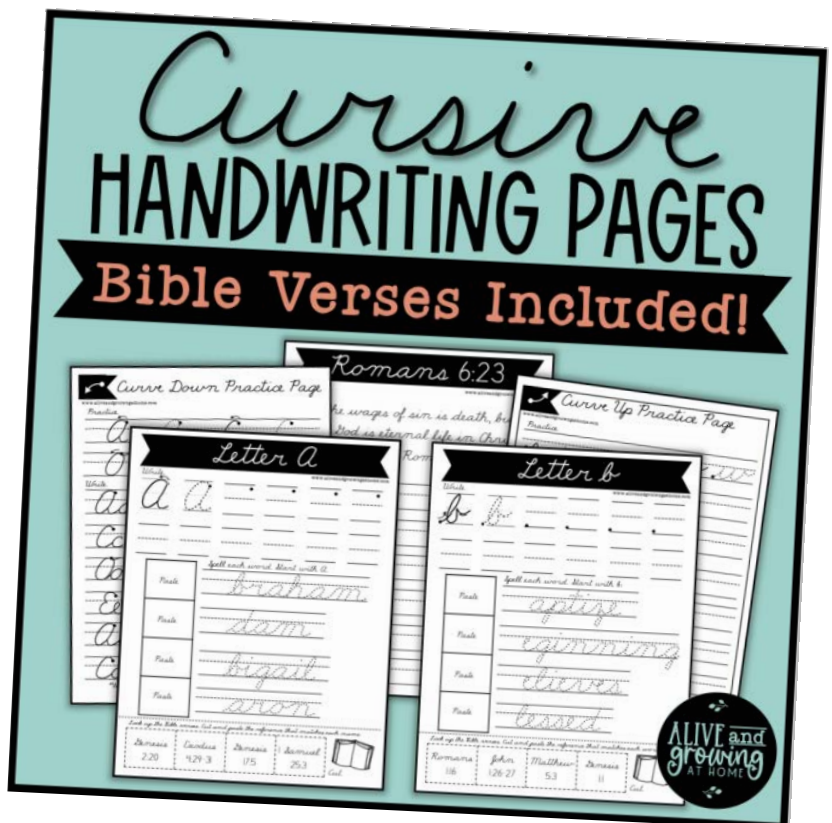

What is False Teaching?: An Introduction

False teaching is any teaching that goes against what the Bible plainly says and/or makes a claim about God, Jesus, or the Holy Spirit that isn't true.

What Does the Bible Say about False Teaching?

Followers of Jesus are told in Scripture to test the spirits of those who claim to be speaking on God's behalf. My mind immediately goes to 1 John 4:1-6 and 1 Thessalonians 5:20-22. In both passages we are told to put man's word to the test. And we are specially told in 1 John how to do this. Take a minute to read those verses now. Some questions you can ask to "test" the spirits are: Do these people deny God's Word? Do they deny that Jesus is God in the flesh?

The topic of false teaching is *extremely* important to God. It's so important that out of the twenty-seven books in the New Testament, twenty of them warn us about false teachers and false teaching! (*Another Gospel?* by Alisa Childers) Peter spends an entire chapter in 2 Peter warning the church about false teachers while Jude pivots from writing about our common faith in Jesus to writing his entire letter about false teachers who had crept their way *into* the church.

Jesus called false teachers and false prophets wolves dressed as sheep. (Matthew 7:15-23) He tells us we can recognize them by their bad fruit, and He warns us not to be deceived by them. *We need to be armed with the truth found in God's Word by reading it daily.* If we don't know the truth, we may easily be deceived, or tricked, by the lies. After all, false teachers/prophets often take the truth (or something that sounds good), then add a lie to it. They may take a Scripture verse out of context and twist its meaning. They may say it means something that it doesn't. This is exactly what our adversary, Satan, does with God's Word. (Genesis 3:1-7 and Matthew 4:1-11)

Did you know there were false prophets in the Old Testament? They were giving Israel a message the people wanted to hear, but they weren't speaking God's message. In the book of Ezekiel, chapter 13, God spends time speaking against these people. Even in the early church, as John was writing 1 John, he was dealing with false teachers who had slipped their way into the church and were spreading lies about Jesus. Are there false teachers and false prophets today? (Absolutely! Just turn on your TV!) We must first armor up with truth so we can recognize the bad fruit of false teachers. Then, we must be willing to speak the truth in love, seasoned with the salt of grace. (Colossians 4:6)

Ideas for Using these Pages

I recommend that you do these pages with your learners OR let them work in small groups of 3-4 (at the most). Afterwards, regroup so you can hear their thoughts and redirect if they are confused.

1. At the top of each of these pages is a false teaching or lie that has, or still is being told, by false teachers/prophets. Read the false teaching aloud.

False Teaching *example*

2. Ask your learners if they've ever heard this lie before. What did they think of it? (The example on [p. 5](#) is the lie that was beginning to be told by those in the early church at the time John was alive.)

If this isn't a lie they've heard before, ask them what they think of it now that they are hearing it for the first time. If time allows, maybe discuss how the truth has been twisted into a lie.

3. Read the Bible verses or passage aloud. If you can read the entire context, I **HIHGLY** recommend doing that, as I've shortened some of the passages to fit into the space.

Underline or highlight the words or phrases within the passage that help you see the lie in the false teaching. In this example, John says he heard, saw, and touched Jesus.

4. At the bottom, give learners time to respond to the lie. How would they "refute" or "test" the false teaching in light of the truth found in God's Word? If kids would rather talk through this instead of writing it down, go for it!

Extend it!

1. Use the verses on the page as a springboard to find even more verses and passages in the that refute the lie. Use cross references or Bible concordances to help you find more.
2. Let learners role play refuting the lies with someone who pretends to hold to the false teaching.
3. Use blank page on [p. 22](#) of this file to create your own page(s).
